Legislative Update

For the past three years, the Illinois State Board of Education has recommended a grant fund increase for both TAOEP and RSSP programs, just to see those amounts cut back to level funding by the General Assembly.

If we are going to break through, it is going to take a ground swell that can only happen if we are all rowing in the same direction. In order to do so, we want to arm you with statistics and figures. Unfortunately, FY14 is the most current set of data that we have from ISBE.

In FY14, TAOEP programs served 22,135 students with an \$11.5 million grant. The average expenditure per student, including \$6,119 GSA Foundation level, was \$6,639.

Traditional public schools average an expenditure per student of \$12,521; a difference of \$5,882 per student in TAOEP programs.

RSSP programs fair similarly as TAOEP. 3,915 students were served by a \$6.3 million grant in FY14, equating to \$1,609 per student. Include the GSA Foundation Level and RSSP students received \$7,728; \$5,093 less than traditional students.

It becomes very difficult to provide the wrap-around services and supports our students need on such limited funds.

Many of our TAOEP and RSSP students come to school with a high number of ACEs, baggage and issues. In order to truly help these students find their path to success, we need to be able to provide more support services along with educational services.

A great way to spread the message of the great things happening in your program is by having student ambassadors. Students, who have overcome their past roadblocks to success, are the best advocates.

Attending an ICEARY Student Ambassador Academy will provide the training students need to advocate for themselves and programs.
